3rd Place Get of Sire 2009 Alpacalooza out of 11 next to Timberland's Apocolyps and Patagonia's Lennox "Rosey" is currently the epicenter of our breeding program. We purchased him at 5 months of age and have had the privilege of showing him to most of the current AOBA judges who agree that he deserves to be a major contributor to gray genetics. There are no spots or blemishes in this blanket and Rosey is holding his micron. We are hoping to breed for "solid" rose gray and that is what he is doing with his outstanding cria (most of whom are solid rose gray!). A quick review of his pedigree going back 3 generations, reveals that there is not a one that hasn't been an excellent producer and held their micron too!

Not only is he a remarkable tuxedo grey with a solid blanket, minimal neck markings, but an unmistakable tuxedo melanocyte migratory pattern BUT he is also a heterozygous BPG. Have a look at RR Gun's Desperado (2008 Cria list) to see what we mean!
